



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## Aim

- Identify positive and negative numbers in context

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
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# What are positive and negative numbers?

- A **positive** number is more than (greater than) zero.
- A **negative** number is less than zero.



# Where do we use positive and numbers in our lives?

- **Whole numbers** that are **greater than 0**, are **positive numbers**.
- We don't put a '+' sign before them because we know from when we learned how to count, that they are greater than zero.
- So, +1 and 1 are the same! +15 and 15 are the same, even +100 and 100 are the same.
- These numbers are greater than '0' and are **positive numbers**.


# Where do we use negative numbers in our lives?

- We use **negative numbers** (numbers less than zero) daily and we might not even realise it!
- We use **negative numbers** in real life in the following ways;  
**e.g.** temperature, buttons in a lift, goal difference in soccer/sports league tables, depths in a swimming pool
- Other real-life contexts such as bank/credit union or post office account balances also use negative numbers.
- The **money you lodge/put in** to your bank account is a **positive number** because you are **adding it in to your account**.
- When you **spend money** or if you **withdraw** (take out) money **from your account**, then that is a **negative number** because you are **taking it from** your account!

# Positive and Negative Numbers



# How do we figure out the difference between numbers?


- When speaking about directed numbers, we **don't** use the words 'plus and minus' when we are reading our sums and our answers.
- We **say positive** ( for + numbers) and **negative** (for - numbers).
- If I asked you "what is the difference between -5 (negative 5) and -1 (negative 1) ?"
- All you need to do is:  
find -5 on the number line and count the jumps until you land on -1.
- So, the difference between -5 and -1 is 4



- If I wrote this as a sum it would look like this;  
$$-5 - -1 = 4$$
- You will be learning more about these sums in 6<sup>th</sup> Class.


What is the difference between -6 and +3?




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
